

Reflection: This time of year, many of us will be looking at our gardens and know that they need to cut out all the dead wood from our plants! So why is it, sometimes we resist to prune? We understand that pruning is vital if we are to bring new life to our plants, but is it that we just don't trust the process?

Life itself can prunes us too. Most often, we do not like the pruning. It can be painful and difficult but, after time, we come to realize that it has enabled us to bear fruit in new and different ways.

Today in John's Gospel we hear Jesus say "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower..." The vine grower that knows better fruit will grow because the vine has been pruned. Do we trust God the "vine grower?" Do we trust that he only desires goodness, happiness and abundant fruit for us? Most often "being pruned" is difficult. However, if we trust our vine grower and believe that growth and plenty will come from the pruning, we will bear abundant fruit in our lives.
