What's Happening in the Church outside our parish? The answer is 'a lot'. One issue that the Diocese is facing is the shrinking number of people and priests in parishes. In 12 years, the Diocese will go from 127 priests to 60 – covering 240 parishes. In response to this, the Diocese is revisiting its mission and has developed a pastoral plan. However, the way in which any plan is implemented requires the ideas, leadership and prayers of lay people.



Some Reflections on Archbishop Bernard's Letter

The archbishop's message today highlights some of the challenges we face, looking ahead. It is a crisis, but they say that in Chinese writing the word 'crisis' is made up of two symbols – one is for danger and the other is opportunity. The danger is clear – the closure of churches and loss of mission. We could end up just managing a declining Church.

But the opportunity is to be creative, less dependent on priests and enable lay people to fulfil their baptismal calling. It is an opportunity to return to the mission entrusted to us by Jesus, something we may have, partly, lost sight of? There are so many in need of hearing the Good News of Jesus.
