



Pope Francis changed the church and the world. His leadership on care of the earth is celebrated by the 97% of environmental scientists who acknowledge the threat that it is caused by human misuse of fossil fuels. He turned it from a political issue into one of faith - this is God's creation and we are stewards. It is now a key part of catholic social teaching.

Pope Francis also focussed on the poor and challenged the rich and powerful. Of course, that is precisely what Jesus does all through the Gospels. His harsh words are never for the poor or weak or sinners, always for the rich, powerful and religious leaders.



He was also a man of prayer, a regular penitent who wants all peoples to be able to participate fully in the worship of the Church in culturally sensitive ways.

He spurned luxury, was humble and often direct. His compassion and desire for those who felt rejected by the Church to know God's love was amazing and transformational for many but, surprisingly, not always well received by others. Some prefer to focus on judgment but Jesus didn't condemn the adulterous woman who was about to be stoned to death. Only those with stones to throw were judged.

Please pray for the repose of the soul of this great saint. And pray especially that his successor will continue to reflect the example, vision, compassion and teaching of Jesus, as Pope Francis did.

O God, eternal shepherd, who govern your flock with unfailing care, grant in your boundless fatherly love a pastor for your Church who will please you by his holiness and to us show watchful care. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.
